Sveti Sava Celebration Sunday, January 31, 2021

Are you prepared for the Kingdom of Heaven?...

Christ is in our midst.

Friend, considering the particular times we live in, I'm going to ask you a very insensitive question.

Are you afraid of death? You don't need to answer.

But who isn't? Nobody really wants to die. That's why we're all masking and sanitizing.

I don't know why you picked up this newsletter. But I hope that it's because in some way you are interested in eternal life. That you know that there is life *after* death. And that you need to *prepare* for it. Because, as the ancient Greek poet and philosopher Archilochus (650 BC) said: "We don't rise to the level of our expectations, we fall to the level of our training."

In other words, you can't really read a book on music and become an opera singer the next day. You can't put aside \$1 today and retire tomorrow. You can't watch a show about weightlifting and win the next world championship tomorrow. You can't kiss the Gospel today and expect to be all set for Eternal Life...

Think for a moment... what's your level of preparation for the Kingdom of Heaven?

Are you ready to look Christ in the eye and say: "I did everything You asked to the best of my ability. I <u>deserve</u> the Kingdom of Heaven..."?

(BTW, if you answered "yes," please make an appointment for confession asap. Or at least read the parable of the Publican and Pharisee.)

Not one of us is really ready. True, you might be much more ready than I am. But you also might not be as ready as you *should* be. That's why I'm writing to you today.

I pray daily that you - and all members of our parish - all end up together in the Kingdom of Heaven. But I'm worried... Because you might be getting wrong information.

I'm sure you've met lots of people who say that all you need to do is to "accept Christ as your personal Savior" and you're good. You hear this daily... Or you hear that God loves you no matter what you've done and there's no need to change.

In the 2000 years of the history of our Church (that's quite a lot of collective experience!), the Orthodox found out *exactly* what Christ meant when He said that the Kingdom of Heaven "is *taken by force*." (Mat. 11:12). Not once does the Gospel say that you can casually stroll into Heaven. The Gospel is full of stories of people who *gave their all* to be with Christ.

God wants the whole of you in your entirety. Your mind, your body, your soul, your thoughts. Everything. Yes, that's a lot to ask. But why would He settle for less? Who would want a relationship with someone who just uses them for free food and lodging? Why would God want me if all I ever do is take-take?

God gave us everything. And all He asked for in return is our hearts.

That's the beginning of the road to the Kingdom of Heaven.

Are you taking? Or are you giving? Want to find out? It's time to start training for the Kingdom of Heaven.

The best time to jump in with both feet is Great Lent. Our Church has laid out a whole system of how we can train for Pascha, and the next life, in a short space of 40 days. Are you ready for this challenge?

A warning: so many people try to reach Heaven without a guide. So many try to swim across the ocean, instead of taking a boat... Don't try to reinvent the wheel. Your Church has all the answers you need.

So start your training today. You can start small, just by making small changes today. But do something for God this Lent. And He'll do so much more for you. If you'd like more rigorous training, please talk to me. I'd love to help.

Here are a few things we can do for ourselves and share with others on our journey on to Great Lent. (This was shamelessly taken from a fellow priest on Facebook. Credit goes to Fr. Aidan Keller.)

- 1. Dairy and meat used up.
- 2. Thorough confession of sins made.
- 3. Any adaptations to the fast rules blessed by your priest in advance.
- 4. Reading material selected and ideally blessed by your priest in advance.
- 5. Plan for charitable giving in place.
- 6. Time arranged with employer so that the main Holy Week services and Pascha can be attended. Presanctified Liturgy should be attended on occasion at the very least; only at this service and a few others do most lay people experience the spirit of the Lenten services, which do not technically include the Sunday Liturgy.
- 7. Forgiveness asked of anyone you have quarreled with.
- 8. And above all, specific increase in prayer discipline blessed by priest in advance.

Hope to see you at Presanctified Liturgy during Lent. I hope you take the time to listen to the beauty of the Great Canon. Find out what Lent really is about.

Do more for God this Lent than you have done last Lent. Then you'll see progress on your way to the Kingdom of Heaven. Amen.

Да ли си спреман да гледаш Христа у очи и рећи: "Све што си ме питао да учиним урадио сам најбоље што могу. Заслужио сам Царство Небеско...."?

(Уосталом, ако си одговорио са "да", под хитно закажи састанак са мном, или бар прочитај причу о Митару и Фарисеју)

Нико од нас никад није заиста спреман. Вероватно ти си више спреман него што сам ја. Али вероватно ниси спреман као што *требаш* бити. Зато ти пишем данас.

Молим се за тебе свакодневно – за све чланови наше парохије – да се сви нађемо у Царству Небеском.

Ипак се бринем...можда добијаш прогрешну информацију.

Вероватно овде си чуо од многих да само мораш "примити Христа као Спаситеља" или као што наши кажу "славим славу" и "има нешто" и све је у реду. Чује се то сваки дан... Или чујеш да те Бог воли без обзира на шта си учинио и стога нема разлога да се промениш.

On Communion and Sickness

Question: During Communion, some priests wipe the spoon after communing each of the faithful, but a majority do not do this. The former view themselves as practical and precautionary, while the latter condemn this approach saying that it confuses the faithful, that it comes from a lack of faith, that it is not in accordance with dogma, and so on. Keeping in mind that the greatest Mystery(Sacrament) of our Faith is in question, what stance should we take in this regard, not just for the sake of uniformity?

Answer: This question, as far as I am familiar with it, was first brought to us and extensively written about between the two world wars by Archimandrite Dr. Petronije Trbojevic. But the standpoint about the need to introduce multiple spoons for communion, or the wiping off of one spoon after communing each individual, he had adopted much earlier. Thus, in September of 1911 he sent a petition to the Holy Synod in Sremski Karlovci requesting that this approach be officially adopted by the entire Metropolinate of Sremski Karlovci.

In this petition, along with reasons of hygiene ("claiming that the single spoon, especially without thorough wiping, can transmit various diseases") and aesthetics ("many communicants, so to speak, shudder when they think about mouths the spoon has been in without any cleaning or wiping), he states one dogmatic reason which he argues thus: Except for the hot water, nothing must be added to Holy Communion. However, when there is saliva caught on the spoon during communion, which is again dipped into the Holy Chalice and partly washed and mixed with Holy Communion: "if the spoon is placed a100 times into the mouth of communicants and again into the Chalice, one can imagine that the wine (the blood) will change in a noticeable way. Then this dogmatic reason becomes more important than the first two reasons".

At the end of the same year, the Holy Synod made this decision: "This petition is not accepted for the reason that the Holy Church has taken care and has enough means so that the faithful are protected from infectious diseases. The aforementioned quasi dogmatic reason has no basis".

Unsatisfied with the Holy Synod's decision, Archimandrite Petronije sent the same petition to Jovan Z. Buta, the editor of "Pravoslavlje" the Theological publication which came out in Sremska Mitrovica, for it to be published there. He refused to print it in the publication with the explanation: "Neither the hygienic nor the aesthetic reason can convince me of the need to change the way of dispensing communion. You have not supported the dogmatic case with any arguments. More so, the dogmatic teaching on this subject kills those two reasons, which seem well founded and justified at first glance. Why? If the teaching of our Church is true...then Holy Communion is fire that burns up every impurity not only of the soul but also of the body.

The Grace of God acts upon the soul as much as the body; the priest prays that Holy Communion be unto the healing of soul and body. The body is sick not only from the lusts of the flesh – but from various diseases". At the end Buta writes: "I am not afraid of infections in Communion, and I've never heard of any priest becoming infected in this way". After the First World War, in July of 1921, Archimandrite Petronije sent his petition to the Holy Synod of the Serbian Church but, again, did not receive a positive response.

In the words of the Lord, the Church throughout the ages believed that Holy Communion: "is the bread which came down from heaven—not as your fathers ate the manna, and are dead. He who eats this bread

will live forever" (John 6:58). Communing, we become one body with Christ the Life-Giver. Who worthily "communes the body and blood of Christ is one body and blood with Him" says St. Cyril of Jerusalem. How this happens is explained very well to us by St. Gregory of Nyssa: "a little yeast makes the whole dough like itself. So, the immortalized body of the Lord through God, being in us, changes and transforms everything to itself".

Nikolaos Kavasilas¹ explains in more detail concerning this that Holy Communion is true food for His Church. "(the Church) in partaking of the Gifts does not turn them into human flesh, as happens with any other food, but She (the Church) is transformed into the Gifts, since the stronger overcomes the weaker. Just like iron placed in the fire eventually becomes fire and does not turn fire into iron. And as we see redhot iron in the fire not as iron but as fire, since fire at some point completely overtakes the characteristics of iron and replaces them with its own, likewise, if one could see such things with his eyes, he would see Christ's Church upon partaking of the Body of Christ being united with the Body of Christ and completely turning into the Body of Christ. Therefore, the Church believes that the faithful, having become one body with Christ through Communion, and thus having come into contact with His divine energies, not only cannot be infected through Holy Communion but that it is the source of life and health. St. John of Kronstadt mentions more cases of healing from various diseases after Holy Communion: "How many times – he says – have I had the chance to see a sick person, who was melted away as wax from a disease, feeble, dying, and after partaking of the Divine Mysteries, in their heartfelt desire, or at my advice, become well quickly in a miraculous fashion" and then he cites an example of an older person, a high school student, a young son of a tradesman, an older woman, a young girl, an adult man and so forth.

If it was as Archmandrite Petronije Trbojevic said, that infections could be spread through Communion, then a majority of priests, especially physically weaker ones, would be sick from various infectious diseases and many of them would have died long ago. However, reality shows something completely different. A majority of them live into deep old age and die from sicknesses that are not infectious. On average, priests are long-lived people. It was the same in older times when, before the spoon was introduced, all the faithful were communed and drank from the same chalice.

Archimandrite Petronije asked J.Z. Buta this question in response to his statement that he is not afraid of infection in Communion: "Would he consume Communion if someone were to put cyanide in to it?" He missed the mark completely, for it is impossible that the very Archimandrite did not notice that the "possibility" of infection is one thing, and the "certainty" of cyanide is another. While honoring the sanctity of the Holy Gifts we cannot exclude the possibility of doing damage to the health of the faithful if we were to administer the Gifts from such [poisoned] chalice, or especially by using wine which had previously been tainted.

It would be an excessive hope in the mercy of God, at the very least recklessness in every respect, of us, God's unworthy co-workers and helpers, if a priest, knowing that the wine was kept in an unsuitable vessel, or was infected with some virus, or poisoned, used it for communion. It should be understood that we the faithful don't think that Holy Communion is a chemical agent that neutralizes poisons, that it is used for those purposes, or to experiment with it like that; it is above all else the Divine means for spiritual elevation, liberation from sin, receiving of eternal life, and resurrection at the last day (John 6:54).

¹ **Nicholas Kabasilas** or **Cabasilas** (Greek: Νικόλαος Καβάσιλας) (c. 1322–1395), born Nicolaos Chamaetos Cabasilas; Orthodox theologian, renowned dogmatist, and saint who lived in Constantinople and very influential in the Orthodox Church to this day.

In Christianity, the main thing and "the one thing needful" was always to gain "the Heavenly instead of the earthly; the eternal instead of the temporary; the incorrupt instead of the corrupt". Everything temporary and bodily is secondary. That is why in the prayers of all three liturgies one always finds supplications for that which is eternal, while prayers for physical needs, health, and other such things are rare.

It may sound paradoxical if we say now, after all that we have brought out, that the Church always knew that Holy Communion can be a source of weakness and illness, even death. Speaking about approaching the Body and Blood of Christ, Holy Apostle Paul says: :" For this reason many *are* weak and sick among you, and many have fallen asleep...(1 Cor. 11:30). But this does not speak of infections from bacillus, bacteria, and viruses gotten through Communion, but about the dangers of those who "unworthily eat the bread and drink from the chalice of the Lord".

In the Liturgy of St. Basil the Great there is the prayer: "O our Lord, Lord of Salvation...us weak in soul and body who are unworthy to commune". Commenting on these words in 1 Corinthians, St. John Chrysostom says: "Many incorrectly ask one another: from where do cases of premature deaths come from, where do long lasting illness come from? The source of many, he (St. Paul) says of these sudden troubles are to be found in sins". That is why Christians today must put all their efforts in the direction of fleeing from sin. The health of the soul will then act toward the health of the body.

The age-old experience and the practice of the Orthodox Church does not allow the understanding of Archimandrite Petronije Grbojevic and other priests who, out of fear of infection, seek the introduction of multiple spoons, or the wiping of one spoon after the communion of each individual communicant.

Finally, I will cite one example which I consider worthy of an exceptional approach. I speak, namely that one should take in to account those persons who are very sensitive, those who in a greater extent are more easily nauseated, for whom it is more easy to vomit, and to whom the spiritual Father needs to condescend and lighten the approach to Holy Communion. This can be brought about without running to extraordinary measures. Until that believer does not become stronger and conquers in himself this weakness, I think an exception could be allowed that he come first in line to communion, before everyone else or at the end after the handing out of the antidoron, when the Chalice is already placed on the proskomedia table and the spoon has been wiped. In this way, we can meet him half way, as much as it is possible without the unnecessary provoking of questions and confusion among the rest of the faithful.

Причешће и Болест. Патријарх Павле

Приликом причешћивања, поједини свештеници бришу каишчицу после причешћа сваког верног, док већина то не чини. Први сматрају да су практични и предострожни, док други осуђују овакав поступак сматрајући да се њиме уноси забуна међу верне, да је знак маловерности, не одговара догматски, итд. С обзиром да је у питању највећа тајна наше вере, какав став треба заузети у овом питању, не само ради једнообразности?

ОДГОВОР: Ово питање, колико ми је познато, први је код нас изнео и о њему опширно писао, између два рата, архимандрит др Петроније Трбојевић. Али је становиште о потреби увођења више кашичица за причешћивање, или брисање једне после причешћа сваког појединца усвојио још раније, тако да је септембра 1911. год. поднео Светом синоду у Сремским Карловцима представку којом је тражио да се званично уведе овакав поступак у целој Карловачкој митрополији.

У тој представци, поред хигијенског разлога ("да заједничка кашика, особито без темељног брисања, може да пренесе разне болести"), и естетског ("многог причесника тако рекући језа ухвати, кад помисли у колико је уста била та кашичица без икаквог чишћења и брисања"), наводи он и један догматски разлог у коме расућује овако: Сем теплоте, Светом причешћу се не сме ништа додавати. Међутим, како се на кашичицу, при причешћивању, ухвати мало пљувачке, која се, кад се кашичица поново умочи у Свету чашу, делимично опере и помеша са Светим причешћем: "Ако се кашика сто пута у уста причесника метне и понопо у путир спусти, може се замислити случај да ће се вино (крв) у осетној мери променити. Онда постаје овај догматски разлог важнији од првих двају разлога".

Крајем исте године, Свети синод је на ову представку донео следеће решење: "Молба се ова не уважава са разлога што се Света црква постарала и има довољно средстава да се верни очувају од заразних болести, а наведени квази догматски разлог нема никаква основа".

Незадовољан оваквом одлуком Светог синода, архим. Петроније достави исту представку Јовану Ж. Бути, уреднику "Православља", богословског листа који је излазио у Сремској Митровици, да се онде објави. Но овај одбије њено штампање у листу с образложењем: "Ни хигијенски ни естегски разлог не може да ме увери о потреби промене у начину причећивања. Догматски разлог нисте никаквим аргументима потврдили. Шта више, догматско учење по овом предмету убија и она два разлога, на први мах основана и оправдана. Зашто? Ако је учење наше Цркве истинито... онда је Свето причешће огањ који сажиже сваку нечистоћу не само душе. него и тела.

Благодат Божја колико утиче на душу толико и на тело; свештеник се моли да причешће свето буде во исцјељеније души и тјела. А тело болује не само од похоти плоти - него и од разних болести." На крају Бута вели: "Ја се не бојим инфекције у причешћу, а нисам још чуо да је и један свештеник био заражен тим путем. После I светског рата, јула 1921. год., поднео је архимандрит Петроније овакву представку Светом синоду Српске цркве, али и тада без позитивног резултата.

Према речи Господњој, у Цркви се кроз векове веровало да је Свето причешће "хлеб који је сишао с неба, а не као што су оци јели и помрли. Ко једе овај хлеб живеће вечно" (Јов. 6, 58). Причешћујући се, ми постајемо једно тело с Христом Животодавцем. Који се достојно "причешћује телом и крвљу Христовом бива истог тела и крви с Њим", вели Свети Кирило Јерусалимски." Врло лепо објашњење како то бива даје нам Свети Григорије Ниски: "Мало квасца све тесто према себи уиодоби. Тако обесмрћено Богом тело Господње, будући у нама, све претвара и мења према себи".

Још детаљније излаже о томе Никола Кавасила велећи да је Свето причешће права храна за Цркву Његову. "И (Црква) причешћујући се њима, не претвара њих у људско тело, као што бива са којом било другом храном, него се она (Црква) претвара у њих, пошто јаче надвлађује. Као што гвожђе стављено у огањ само постаје огањ, не претвара огањ у гвожђе. И као што усијано гвожђе не видимо као гвожђе, него просто као огањ, иошто се особине гвожђа потпуно губе због огња, тако и Христова Црква, кад би је ко могао видети онда кад се сједини с Њим и причести се Његовим телом, не би видео ништа друго него само Господње тело". Стога Црква верује да верни поставши причешћем једно тело са Христом, и дошавши тако у додир са Његовим божанским енергијама, не само да не могу да се заразе преко Светог причешћа, него да је оно извор живота и здравља. Свети Јован Кронштатски помиње више случајева исцељења од разних болести после Светог причешћа: "Колико сам пута - вели он - имао прилике да видим болеснике истопљене као восак од болести, потпуно малаксале, умируће, а који су после причешћа божанским тајнама, по својој срдачној жељи, или по мојој препоруци, на чудесан начин брзо се опорављали", па износи случај једног старца, једног ученика ниже гимназије, синчића трговца, старице, једне девојчице, одраслог човека итд.

Кад би онако бивало како вели архим. Петроније Трбојевић, и кад би се преко причешћа ширила зараза, то би већина свештеника, особито физички слабијих, боловала од најразличнијих заразних болести и многи од њих већ давно помрли. Међутим, стварност показује сасвим друго. Велики број њих доживљава дубоку старост и умире од болести које нису заразне. У просеку свештеници су дуговечни људи. А тако је било и у старије доба кад су, пре увођења кашичице, сви верни причешћујући се, иили из истог путира.

Питање које поставља архимандрит Петроније Ј. Ж. Бути, на изјаву овога да се не боји инфекције у причешћу: Би ли он употребио причешће у које би усули цијанкалија? сасвим промаша циљ, јер не може бити да и сам архимандрит није примећивао да је друго "могућност" заразе, а друго "извесност" цијанкалија. То пак што сео указивању поштовања Светим тајнама, тако и искључење могућиости штете која би могла наставити за здравље верних кад би у таквом путиру стајало вино, које не постаје одмах, чим се улије у њега, крв Христова.

Било би прекомерно уздање у милост Божју, у најмању руку лакомисленост за сваку осуду, недостојна нас као сарадника, помоћника Божјих (1 Кор. 3,9), кад би свештеник знајући да је вино било у неодговарајућем суду, или заражено каквим вирусима, или отровано, да га употреби за причешће. Јер треба схватити да ми верни не мислимо да је Свето причешће хемијско средство за неутрализацију отрова, те да се може у том циљу употребљавати, или с њим тако

експериментисати, него пре свега и изнад свега божанско средство за духовно уздизање, ослобођење од греха, задобијање живота вечног и васкрсења у последњи дан (Јн. 6, 54).

У хришћанству је свагда било главно, и "једино од потребе": задобити "уместо земаљског-небеско; уместо привременог-вечно; уместо трулежног-нетрулежно". Све привремено, телесно долази у други план. Зато се у молитвама све три Литургије свагда налазе прозбе о вечном, 11 а о телесним потребама, здрављу и другом ретко.

Може звучати парадоксално ако сада, после свега онога што смо изнели, кажемо да се у Цркви свагда знало да Свето причешће заиста може бити узрок слабости и болести, па чак и смрти. Говорећи о приступању телу и крви Христовој, Свети апостол Павле вели: "Зато су међу вама многи болесни и доста их је умрло..." (1 Кор. 11, 30). Но ту он не говори о зарази од бацила, бактерија и вируса, добијених преко причешћа, него о опасности за онога који "недо- стојно једе хлеб и пије чашу Господњу".

У молитви Литургије Светог Василија Великог "Боже наш, Боже спасати... ниже немошчна душсју и тјелом от јеже недостојње сих прича- чатисја". Тумачећи ово место 1 Коринћанима, Свети Јован Златоуст вели: "Многи у недоумици питају један другог: Откуд настају превремени смртни случајеви, откуд дуготрајне болести? Узрок многих, говори он (Павле), од ових нзненадних невоља налази се у гресима".в Зато све своје старање хришћанин и данас треба да упути у правцу избегавања греха. Здравље душе дејствоваће онда на здравље тела.

Вековно искуство, дакле, и пракса Православне цркве не даје за право схватању архимандрита Петронија 'Грбојевића и оних свештеника који, из бојазни од заразе, траже увођење више кашичица, или брисање једне после причешћа сваког верног.

На крају указаћу на један случај за који сматрам да има места да се изнимно поступи друкчије. Мислим, наиме, да треба узети у обзир постојање света преосетљивог, у већој мери гадљивог, код кога долази лако до повраћања и коме би пастир-духовник требало на неки начин да снисходи и олакша приступање Светом причешћу. Но и то би се могло извести без прибегавања неким ванредним мерама. Док такав верник не ојача и не савлада у себи ову слабост, мислим да би му се, изузетно, могло допустити да се причести на почетку, пре свих, или сасвим на крају, после дељење антидора, кад је путир већ пренесен на проскомидију и кашичица по причешћу отрвена. На тај би се начин њему изашло у сусрет, колико је могуће, без непотребног изазивања питања и уношења недоумице код осталих верних.

На Српском, Молитва у време епидемије. да се чита ујутру код куће: Господе Боже наш, Ти си богат милосрђем и премудрим Промислом Својим управљаш животом нашим; Ти Сам, Човекољупче, услиши молитве наше, прими покајање наше за грехе, смилуј се на нас као што си се смиловао на Народ Свој у дане цара Давида и заустави ширење заразе новојављеном опаком болешћу. Лекару душа и тела наших, подари исцељење и опоравак оболелима, а здраве сачувај од ове и сваке друге болести, да бисмо сви једним устима и једним срцем хвалили, славили и благосиљали пречасно и величанствено име Твоје.
